

 - Existing practice
 - International declarations / statements
- Technical input into CPA discussions on benchmarks
 - Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA)
 - Assemblée Parlementaire de la Francophonie (APF)



Survey Methodology: Questionnaire

- Based on Standards
- Measure perception gap between
 - Legal powers of the legislature
 - Powers legislators exercise in practice
- As differently perceived by
 - Legislators
 - Legislative staff
 - Civil Society Organizations (CSOs)
- Useful for diagnostic or reform efforts;
- Useful in addressing issues of "stove-piped" or "siloed" approaches to parliamentary development

Survey Methodology: Interview

- Guided interview
 - Administered by NDI staff
- 25 two-part sets of affirmative statements:
 - Formal powers
 - Actual practice
- Statements designed to elicit a range of responses, rather than yes or no answers
 - Strongly Agree
 - Agree
 - Disagree
 - Strongly Disagree


2008 pilot in Bosnia-Herzegovina






Example: Budget (Statement 12)



Budget (All)




Budget (Colombia)

Statement 14: The legislature determines and approves its own budget:




• The differences may suggest lack of inclusion among the women respondents in the process of developing the legislative budget.


Statement 21b. In practice, the legislature uses mechanisms for receiving and considering public views on proposed legislation.

Next Steps

- Customize questionnaire to inform and support reform: organization, function, election/status, values
- Integrate questionnaire into parliamentary reform projects
- Use questionnaire to promote dialogue between CSOs, representatives and staff to narrow perception gaps
- Share with legislators and staff
 - Identify areas of potential reform
 - Promote full use of legislature's powers
